Our topic for this half term is Winter.

English

We have been working hard to apply our phonic skills to read and write simple words. We are continuing to practise our letter sounds and we will shortly be moving onto the digraphs e.g sh, ch, th.

We are beginning to write simple sentences and will practise thinking of a sentence, saying it out loud then writing it down.



Alongside the Winter topic, we will also be looking at several Julia Donaldson stories including the Gruffalo and the Gruffalo's Child.



Understanding the world

We will have lots of fun investigating and exploring snowflakes.

We will observe changes including freezing and melting. We will begin to try and find answers to some of our questions e.g. What might happen to a snowman in Summer?

Communication and Language

We will look at how and why questions. We will begin to ask and answer questions about stories we have read.

Physical

Explore moving in different ways and find ways to link movements together to make a simple dance. We will look at ways to keep warm and stay safe in the winter.

Maths

Our focus this term will be on recognising, ordering and writing numbers to 10 and to begin to work on numbers to 20. We will continue to develop our adding and taking away skills. In shape and space we will be finding out about pattern and capacity.

Creative

Draw and paint snow pictures. Make snowflakes and explore different ways to snip the paper to make a pattern. We have been really keen to draw different things so we will continue to build on this during this term. We will use simple how to draw resources to follow the steps to draw different animals.

We will take part in circle time activities linked to friendship, working together and taking turns.
