What kind of words have we created when the '-ity' suffix has been added?

They are both nouns

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speciality

majority

What kind of root words was the '-ity' suffix added to?

'special' and 'major' are both adjectives

The '-ity' suffix usually changes adjectives into nouns.

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'Special' and 'major' are easy root words to add the '-ity' suffix to because they don't change.

special + ity = speciality

major + ity = majority

But do all root words behave this way?

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How do 'active', 'sensitive' and 'captive' change when they become nouns?

active -- activity

captive --> captivity

sensitive --> sensitivity

When the -ity suffix is added, the 'e' from the end of adjectives usually disappears.

Does this always happen?

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How do 'active', 'sensitive' and 'captive' change when they become nouns?

flexible \rightarrow flexibility

able → ability

visible -- visibility

possible --> possibility

When the suffix is added, the 'le' from the end of adjectives usually disappears and its replaced by '-ility'.

Can you think of any other nouns where this happens?

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Which word didn't belong in a group?

curious --> curiosity

What's happened to the root word?

'Curiosity' is an exception to the usual rules and a word that you must learn to spell as it is a Y5/Y6 statutory spelling word.
