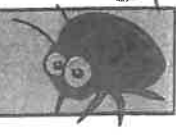


Colons



Colons can be used to introduce a list or an explanation.

Our playground has lots of things: a slide, a roundabout and swings.

In an explanation, the first part is explained by the second part.

I'm so tired: I didn't sleep last night.

The part before the colon must always be a main clause.

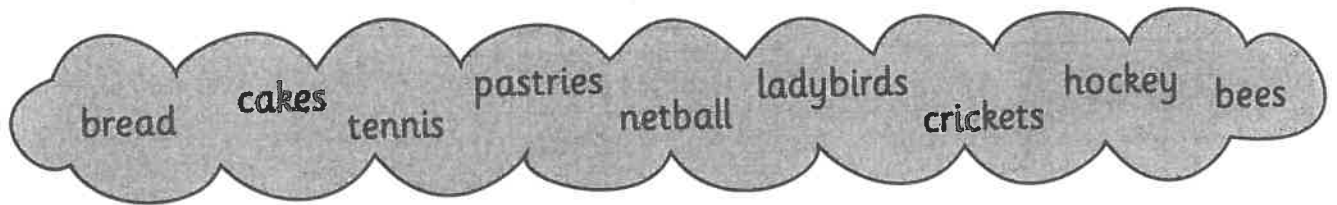

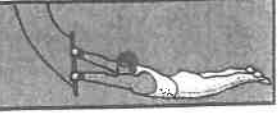

Semi-Colons



Semi-colons can separate long phrases or clauses in a list. This is usually when there are other punctuation marks in the items.

At the vets I saw three tiny, ginger cats; two dogs, both with broken legs; and a long-haired rabbit.

Unlike with commas, you need a semi-colon before the last item.

Semi-colons can also join two clauses in a sentence instead of a conjunction. They both have to be main clauses, equally important and about the same thing.

Jake hated the film; Helena thought it was brilliant.
