We want to inform you that we are not affected by this issue as we do not have RAAC in our building and therefore it will continue to function as normal.

Every Tuesday afternoon we are going to run forest school activities for the whole school. We will be working in collaboration with Nikki Kell (Nikki Noo Noo), who we have worked with in the past. Every Tuesday, children should come to school in PE kit for their outdoor session. As the weather changes, I will inform you of the clothing required to take part in the activities.
